


# Countywide Population Density 2009 - 2010

- Los Angeles County (LAC) consists of 88 incorporated cities which is 20% of all cities in California and a total population of 10,416,096.
- LAC covers 4,084.49 square miles and is 2.6% of all the land area in California.
- Population density in LAC measuring the number of people per square mile is 2,551 as compared with 236 in California.
  - Population density in the United States measuring the number of people per square mile is 96.

(N =10,416,096)










The Countywide Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI is a federal formula based on mental health service utilization rates for Total Population provided by the State to the County (10,416,096 x 6.8% = 708,294). Prevalence Rate for each ethnic group varies between 6.2% and 7.7%. Table 4 shows the adjusted total at 735.033. Native Americans not graphed.



The Countywide Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI for population living at or below 200% FPL is a federal formula based on mental health service utilization rates for 200% Poverty Population provided by the State to the County (3,734,626 x 7.5% = 280,097). The 200% FPL means a family income of less than \$44,100 for a family of four. Prevalence Rate for each ethnic group varies between 6.8% and 7.5%. Table 6 shows the adjusted total at 273,191.












March 2010









