

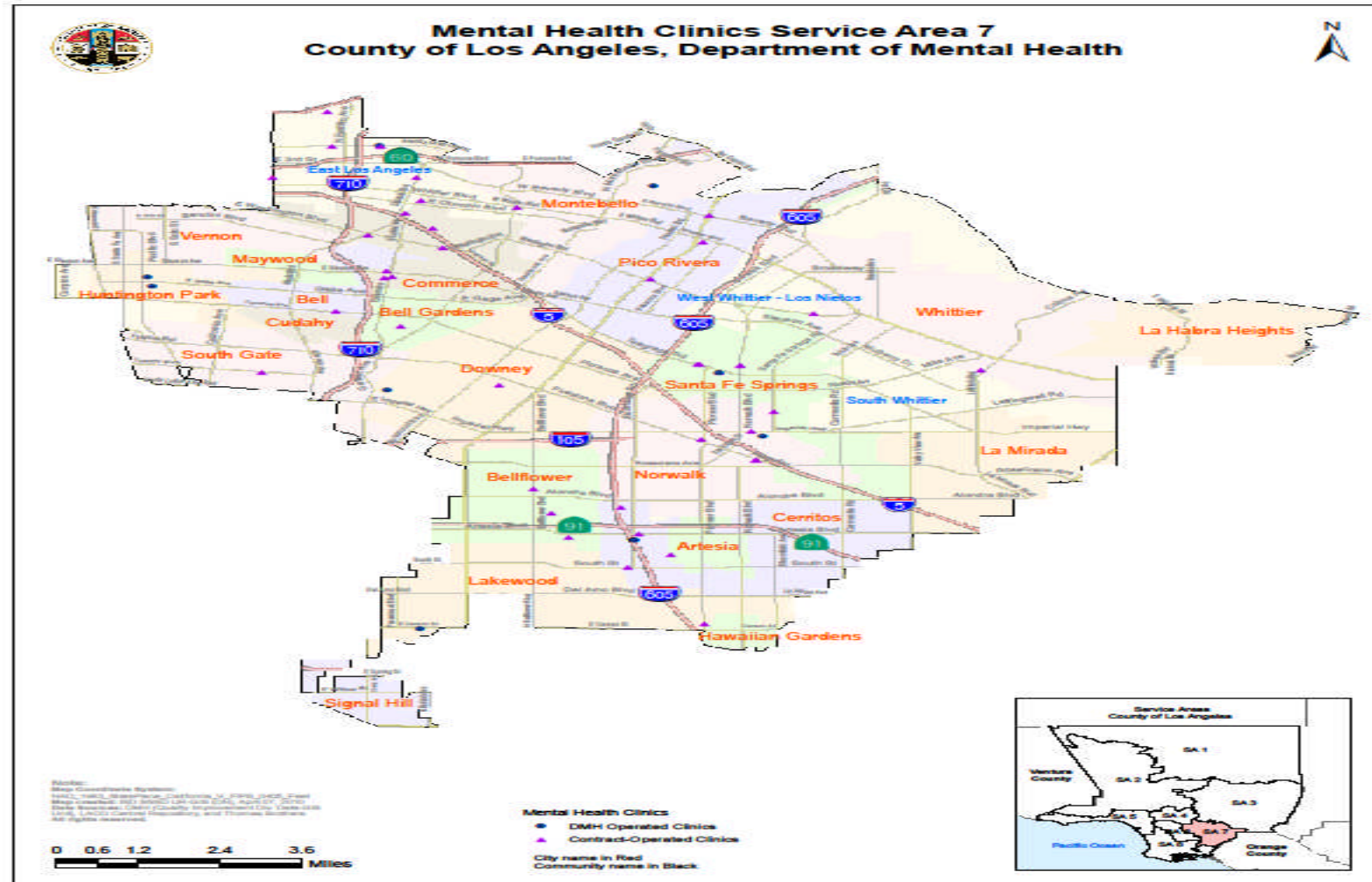

# Map of Service Area 7

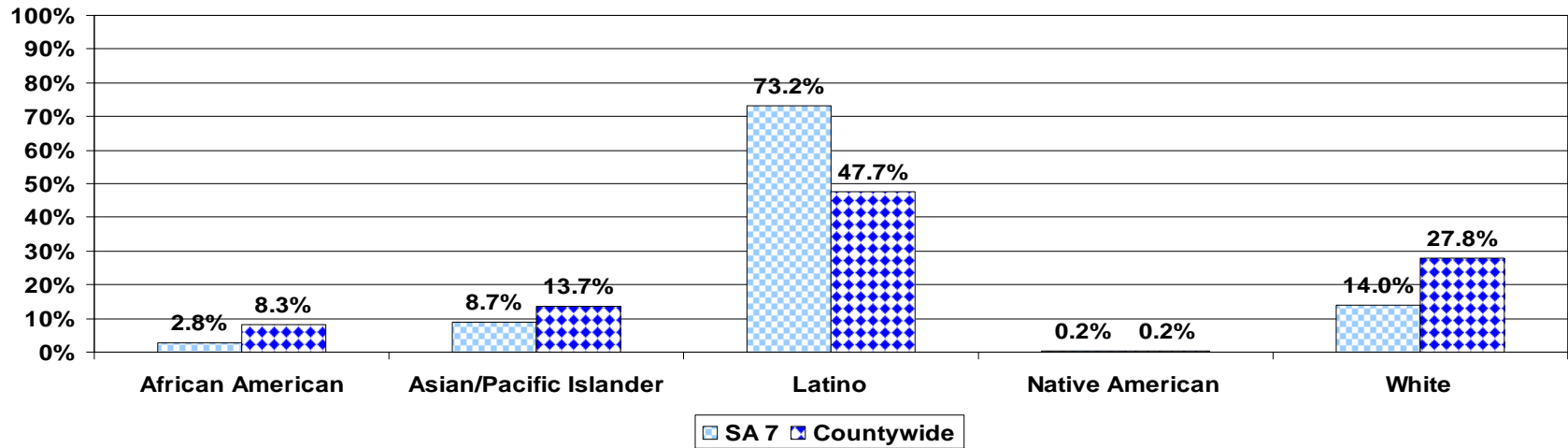


# Cities and Population Density

## SA 7 - CY 2010

- SA 7 consists of 21 legal cities or 23.9% of all cities in Los Angeles County (LAC) and has a total population of 1,294,321.
- SA 7 covers 158 square miles and is 3.9% of the land area of LAC.
- Population density in SA 7 measuring the number of persons per square mile is 8,192 ( $1,294,321/158$ ) as compared with 2,418 in LAC.
  - Population density in California measuring number of persons per square mile is 239.
  - Population density in the U.S. measuring number of persons per square mile is 87.

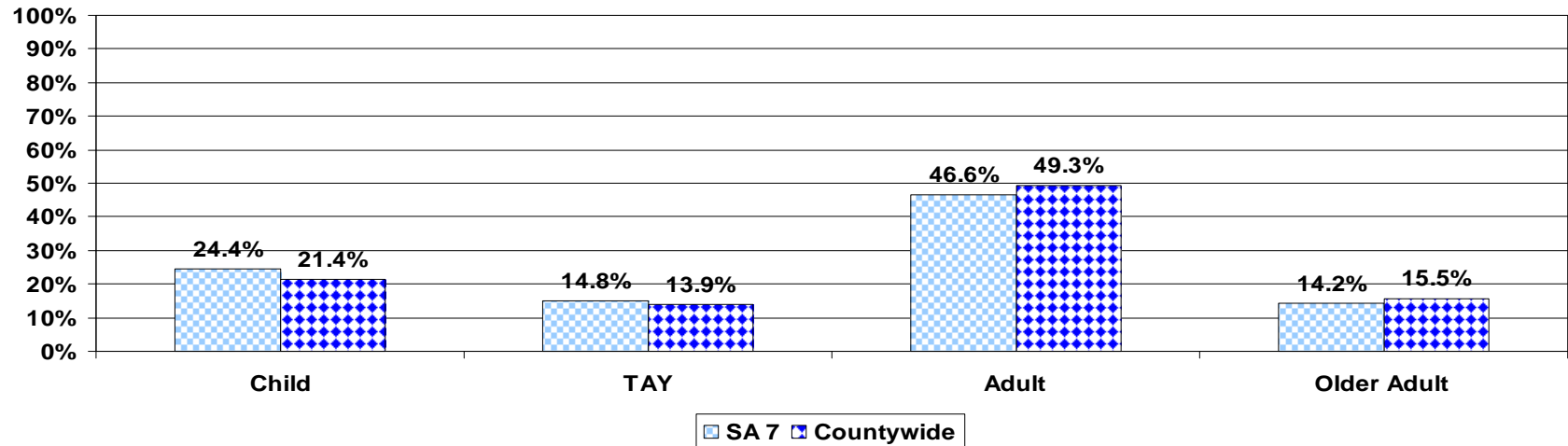
Figure 1: Population by Ethnicity

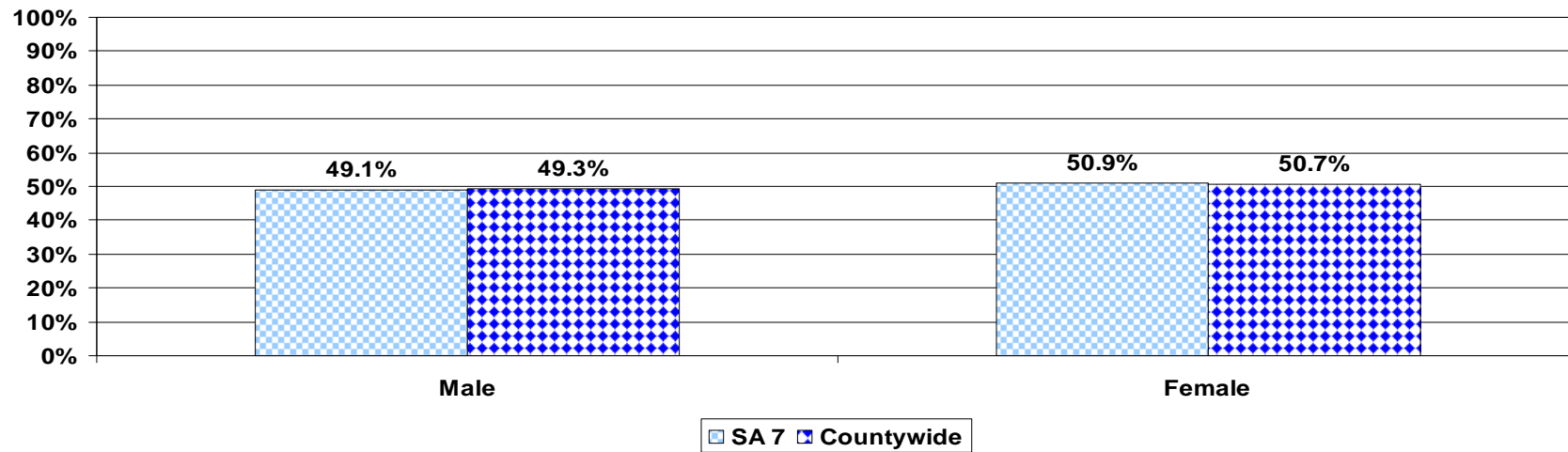
Figure 2: Population by Age Group in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

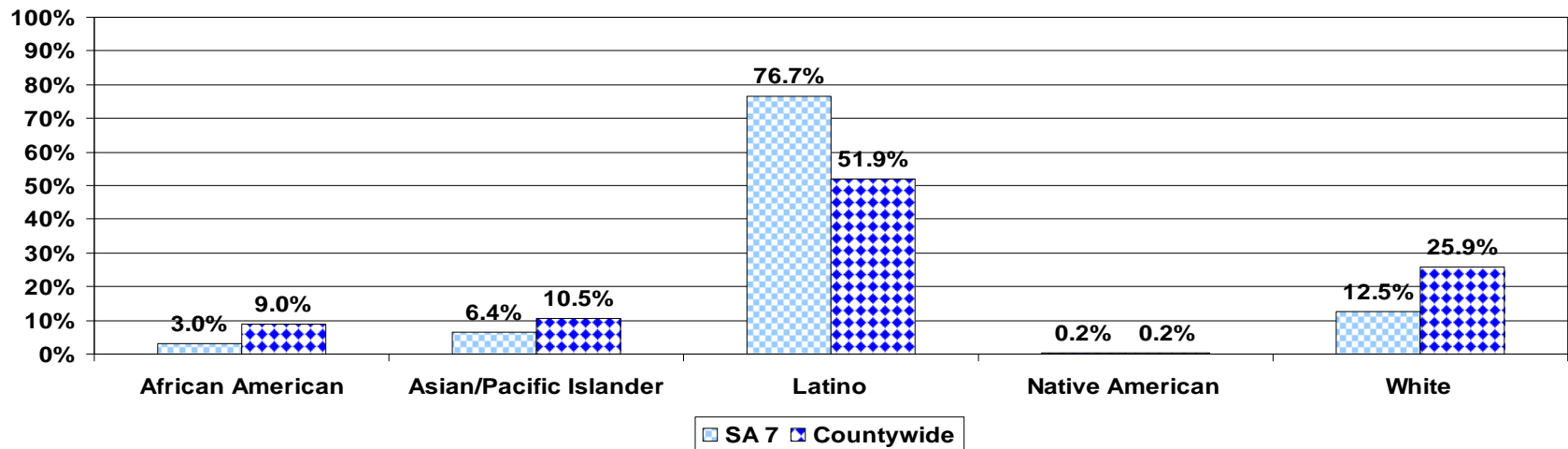

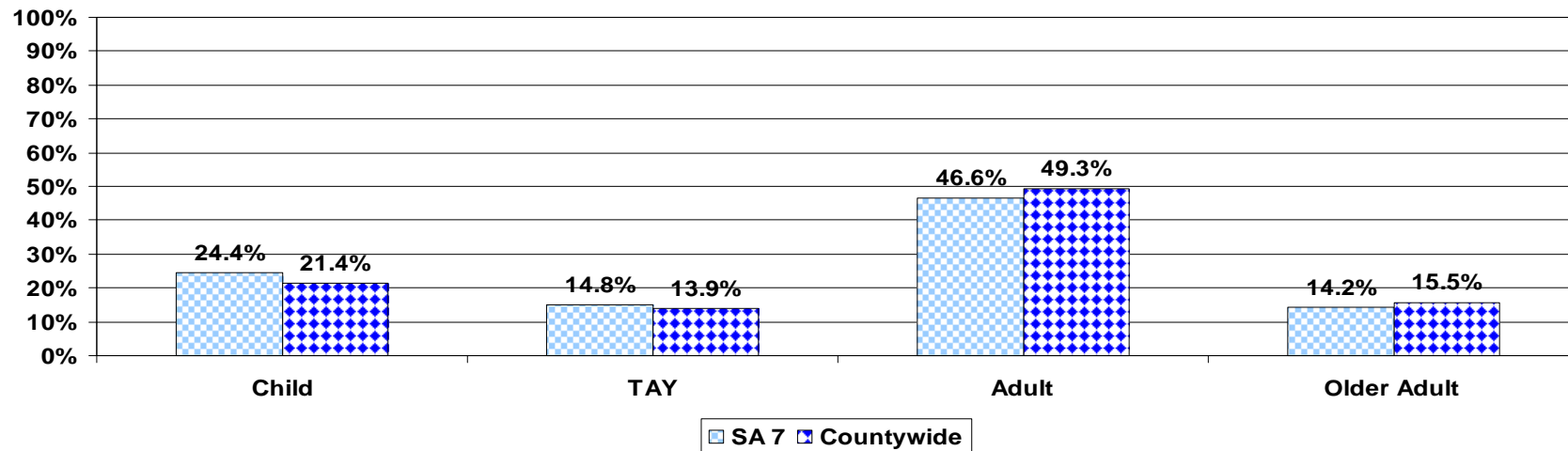
Figure 4: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI<sup>1</sup> by Ethnicity in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

CY 2010**

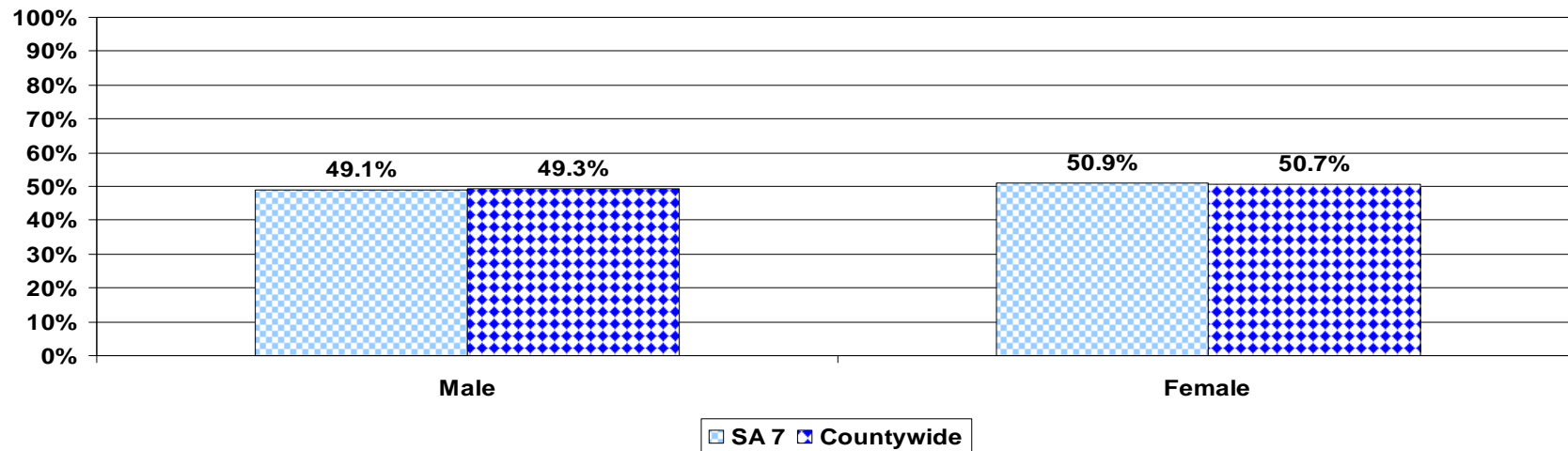

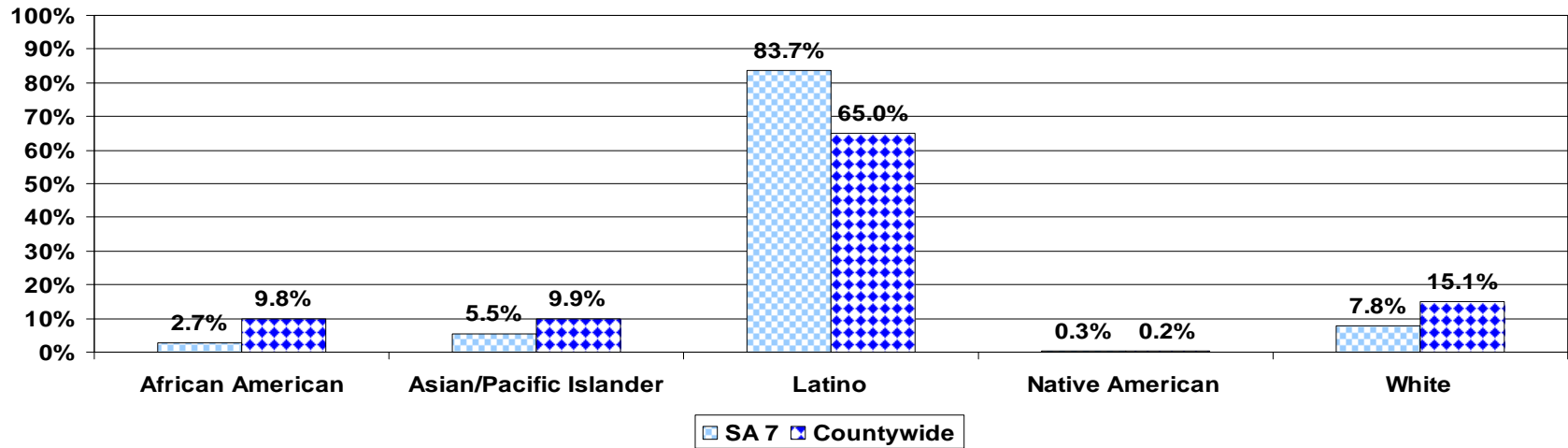
Figure 6: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI<sup>1</sup> by Gender in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

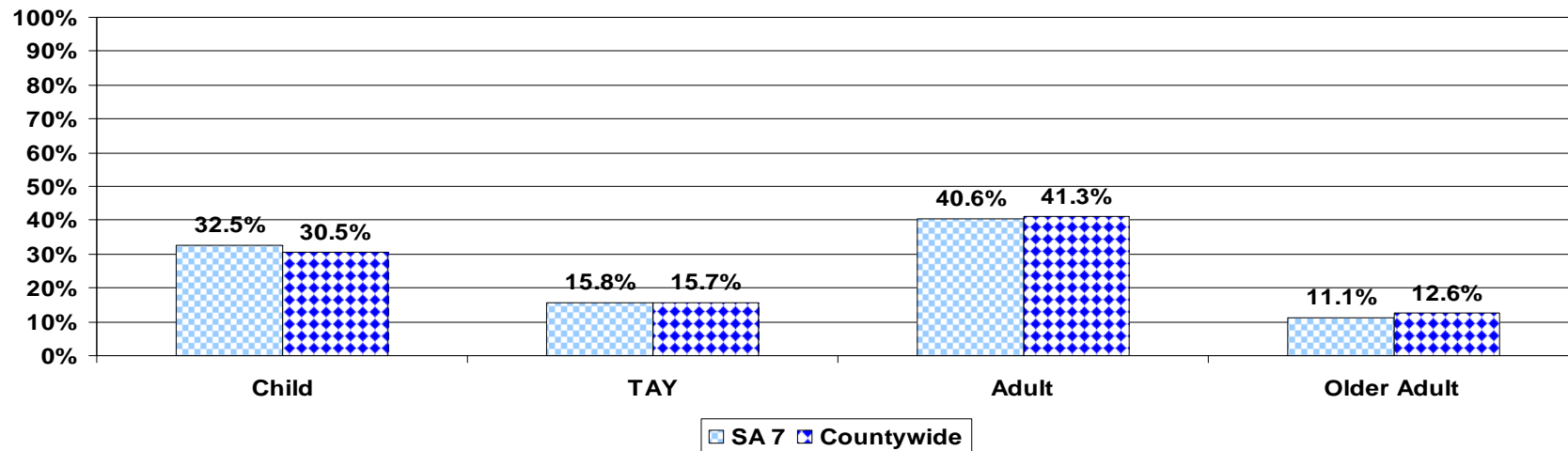
Figure 7: Estimated Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level by Ethnicity in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

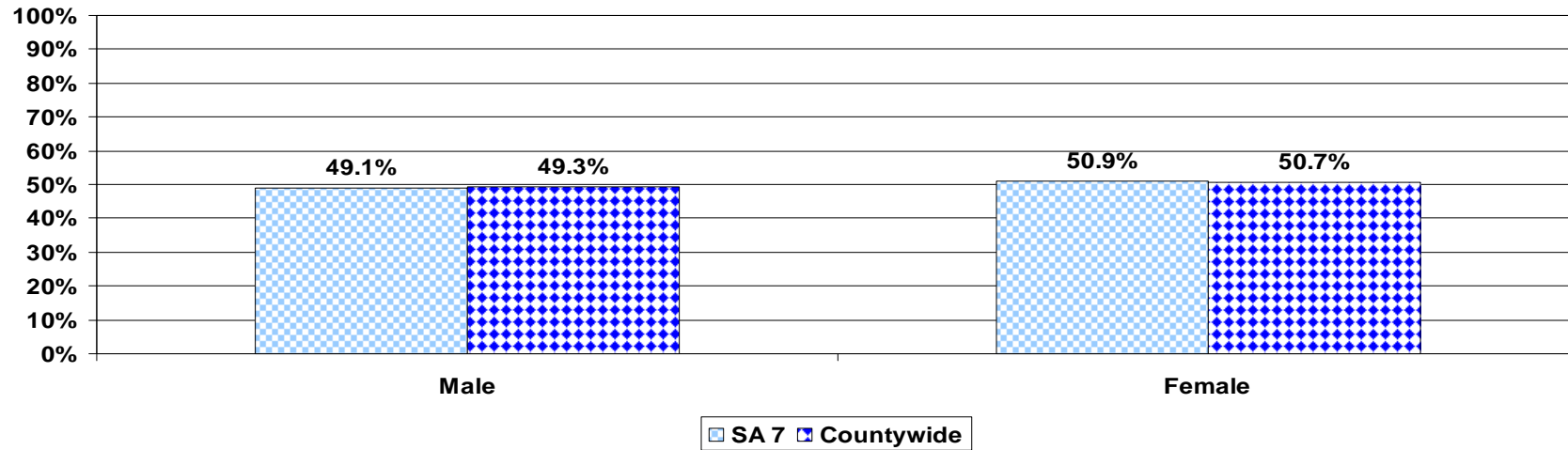
Figure 8: Estimated Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level by Age Group in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

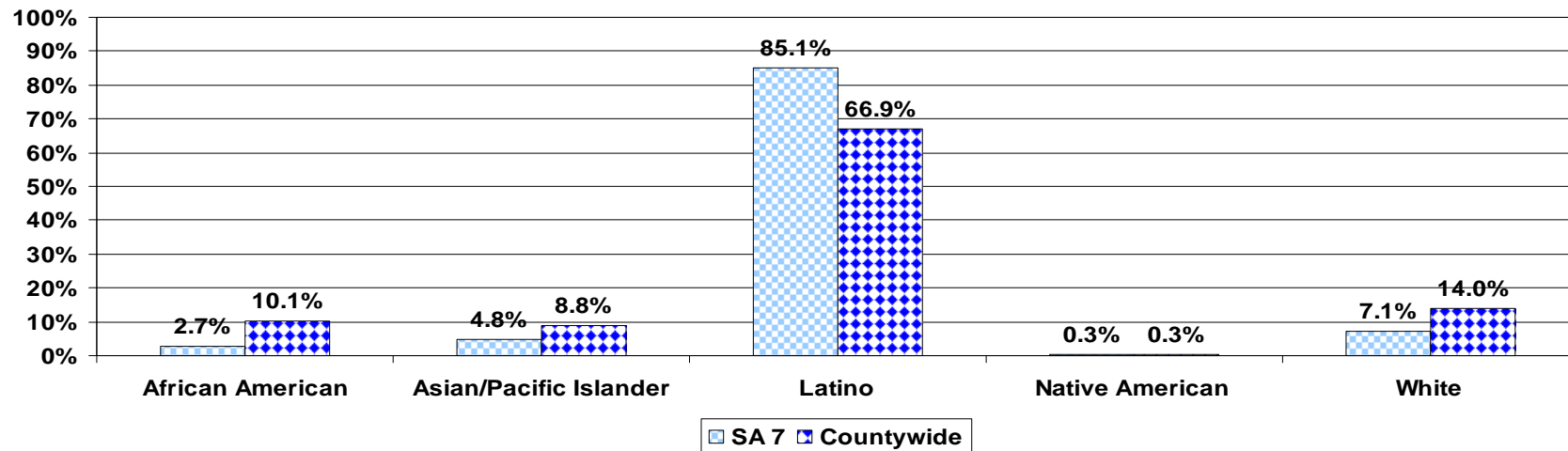
Figure 9: Estimated Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level by Gender in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

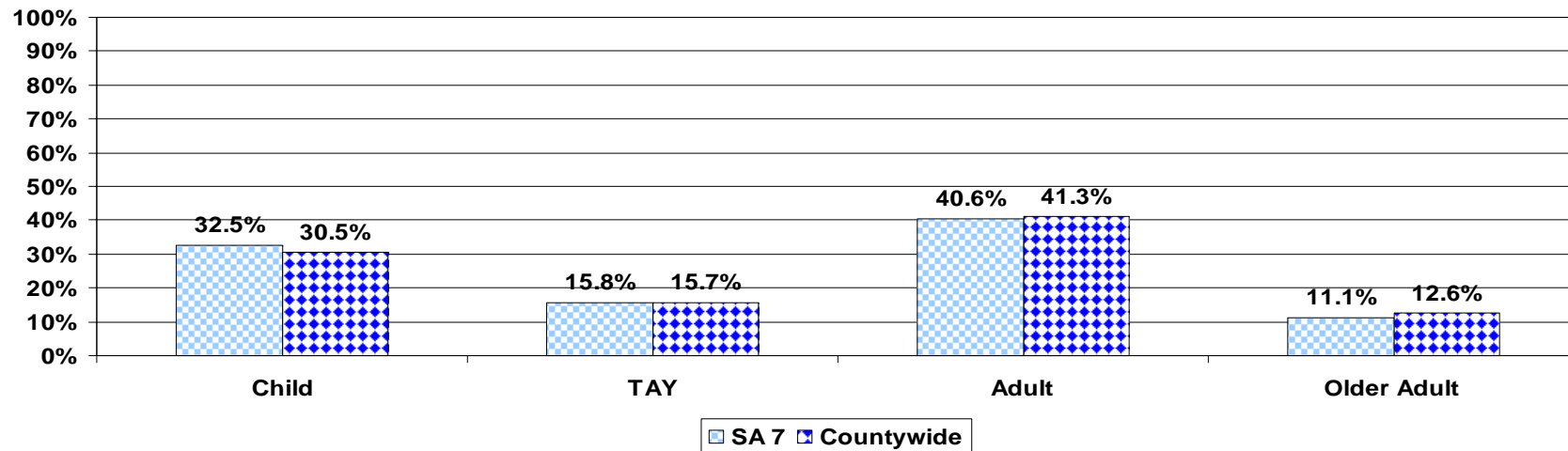
Figure 10: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI by Ethnicity Among Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

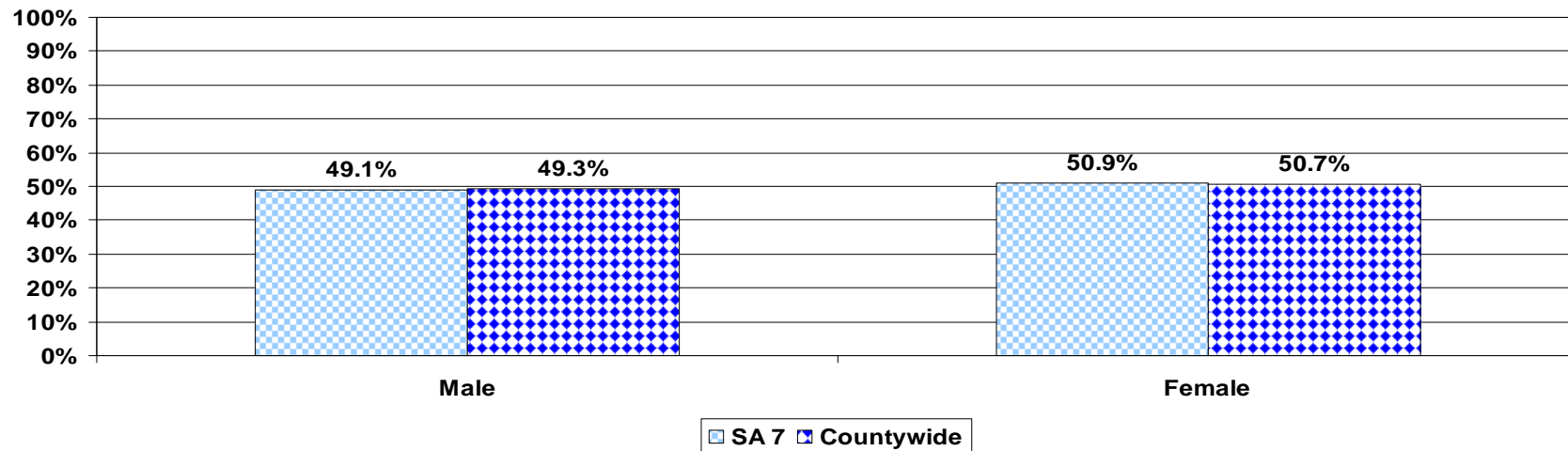
Figure 11: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI by Age Group Among Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

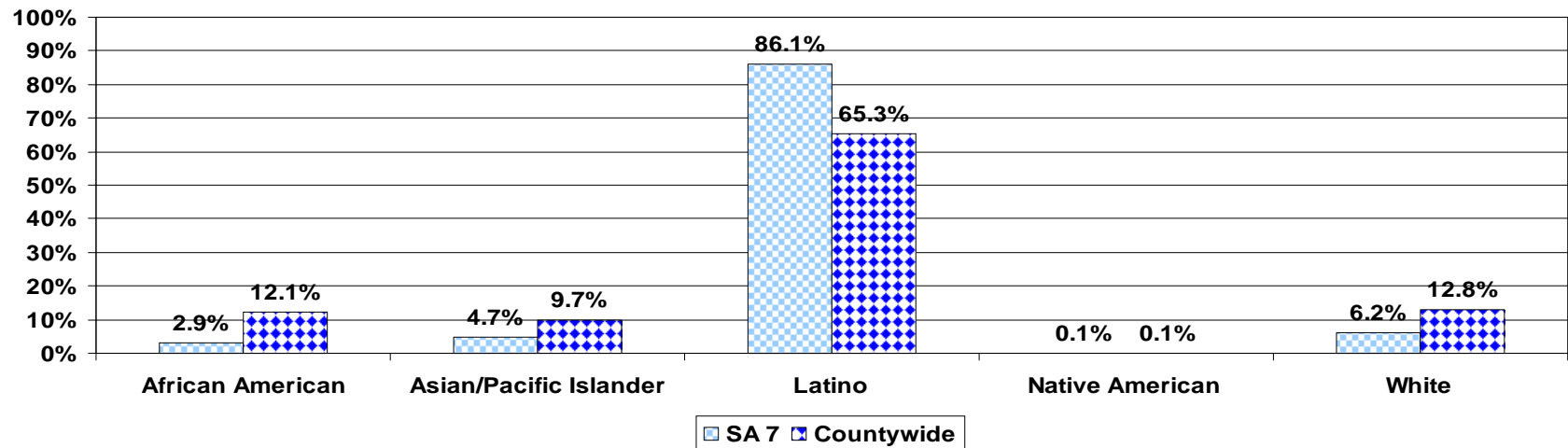
Figure 12: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI by Gender Among Population Living At or Below 200% Federal Poverty Level in SA 7 Compared with Countywide CY 2010

Figure 13: Medi-Cal Enrolled Population by Ethnicity in SA 7 Compared with Countywide March 2011

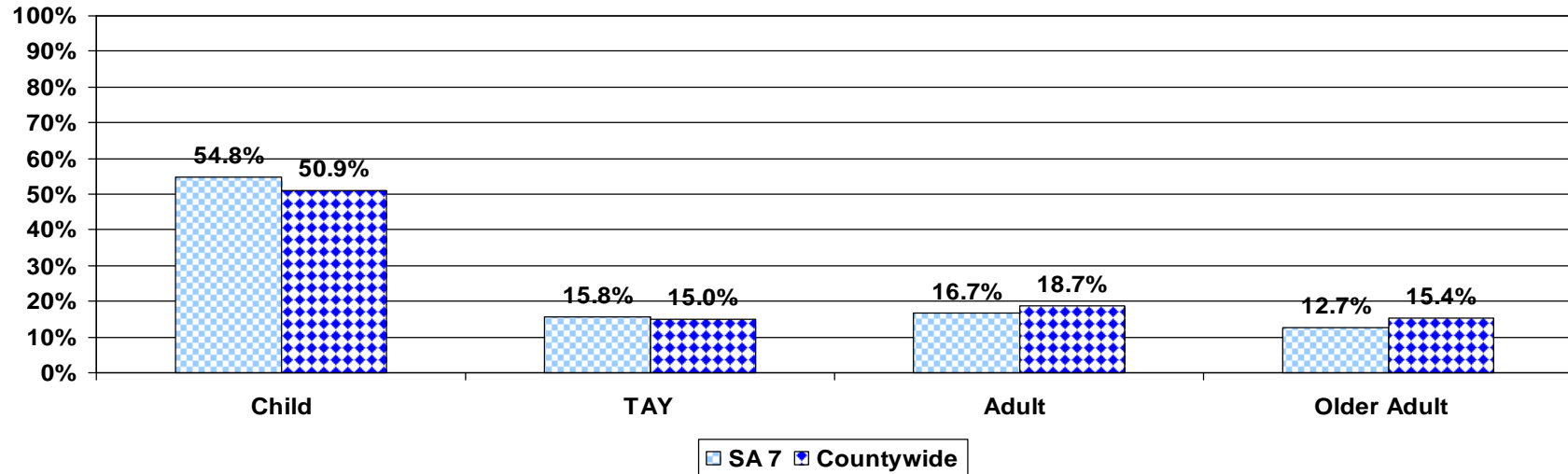

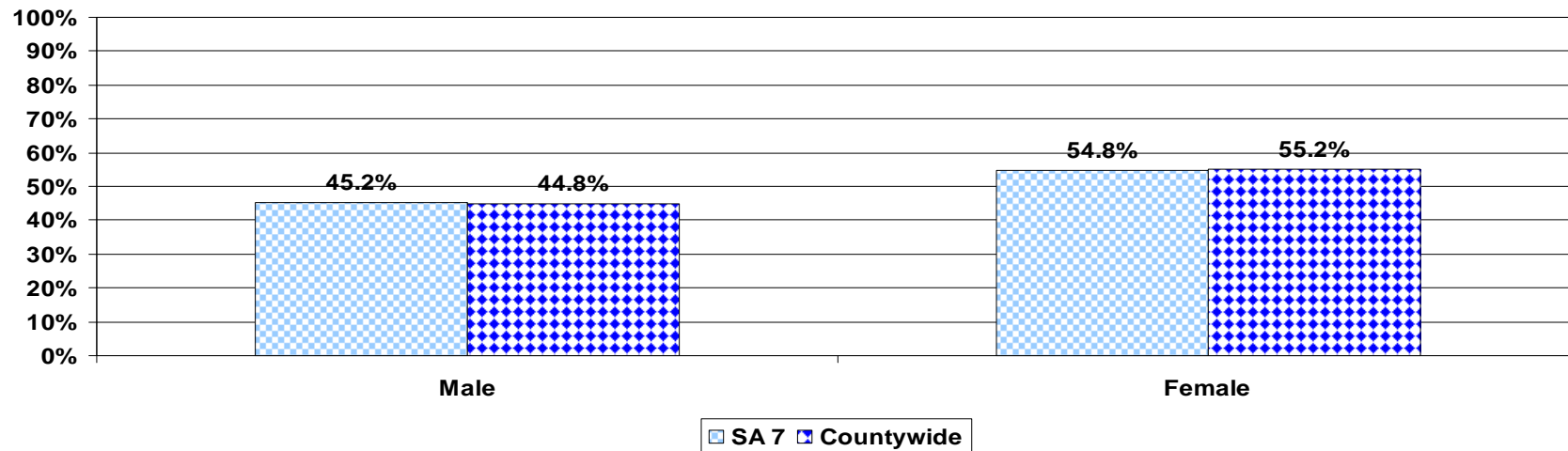


Figure 14: Medi-Cal Enrolled Population by Age Group in SA 7 Compared with Countywide March 2011



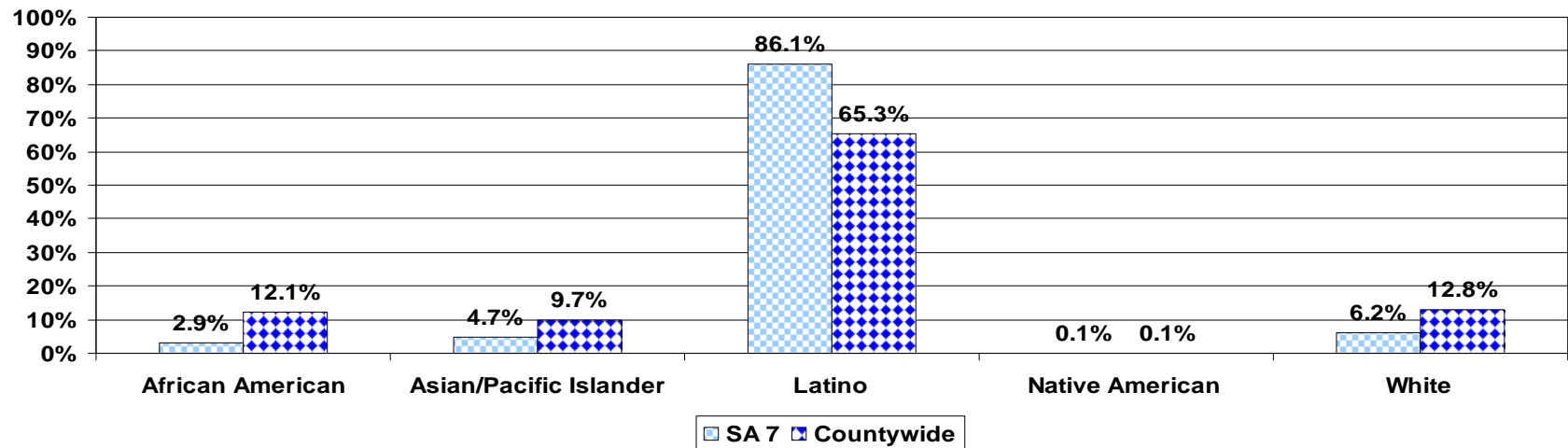

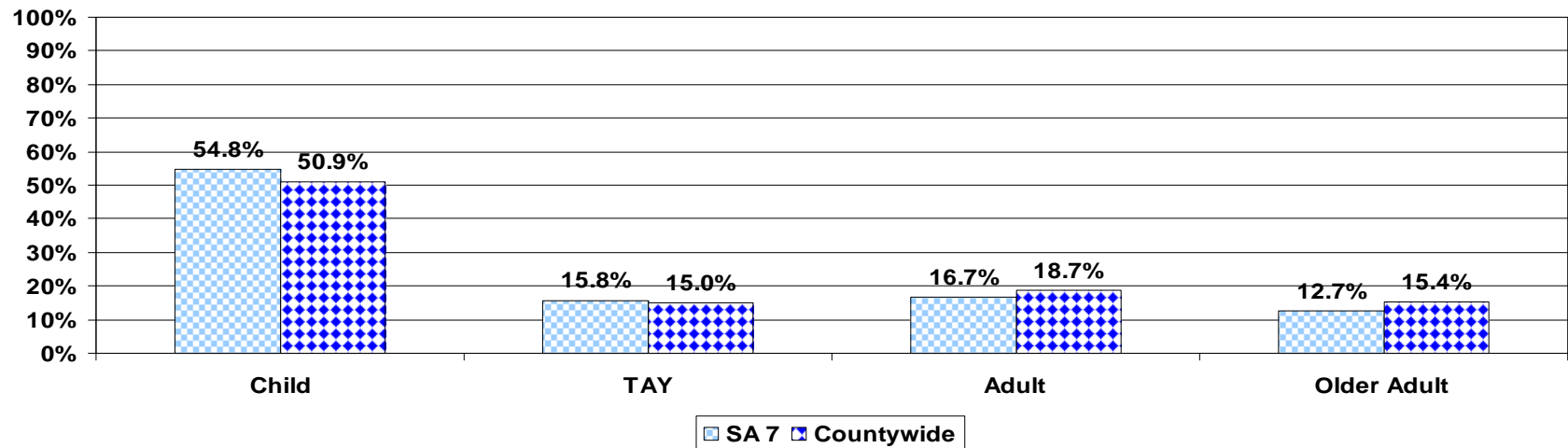
Figure 16: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI Among Medi-Cal Enrolled Population Ethnicity in SA 7 Compared with Countywide

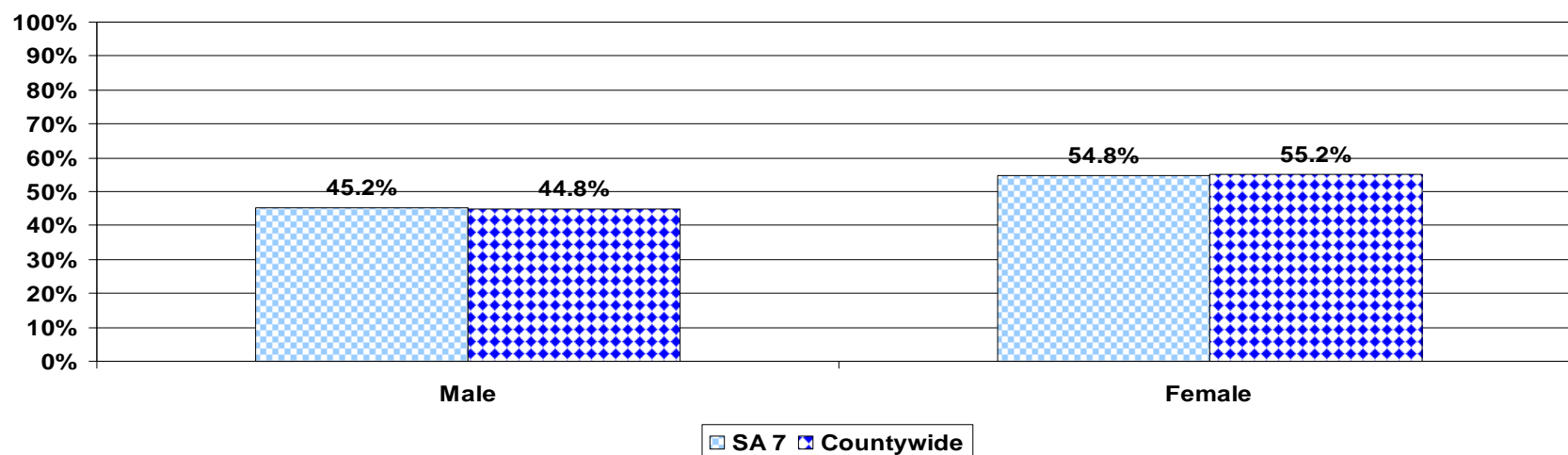
Figure 17: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI Among Medi-Cal Enrolled Population by Age Group in SA 7 Compared with Countywide March 2011

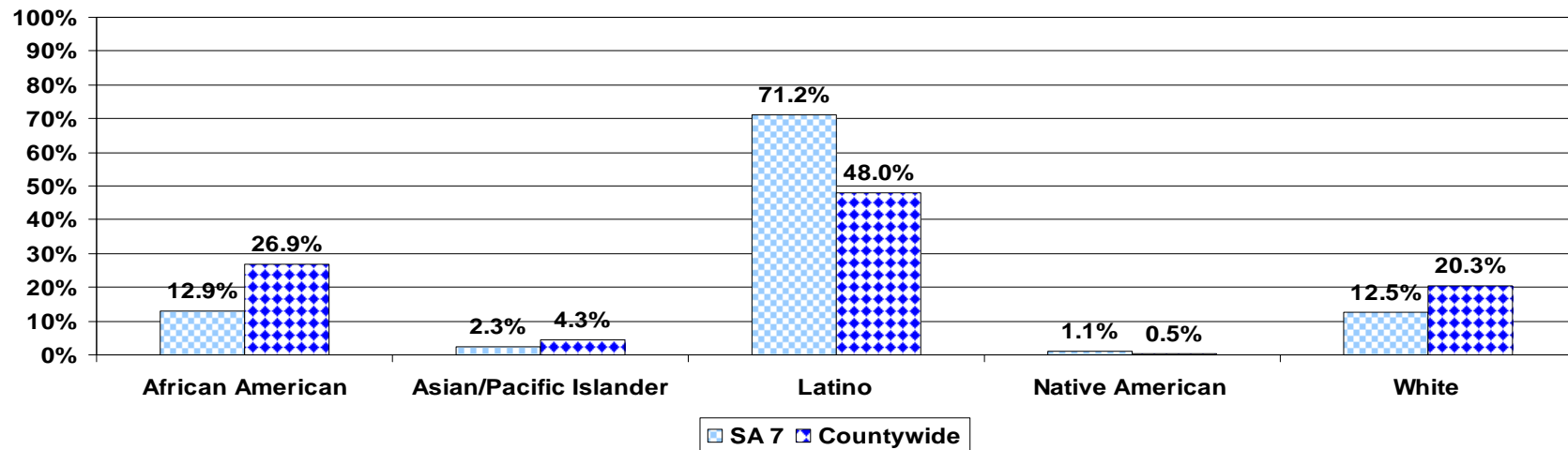
Figure 18: Estimated Prevalence of SED and SMI Among Medi-Cal Enrolled Population by Gender in SA 7 Compared with Countywide

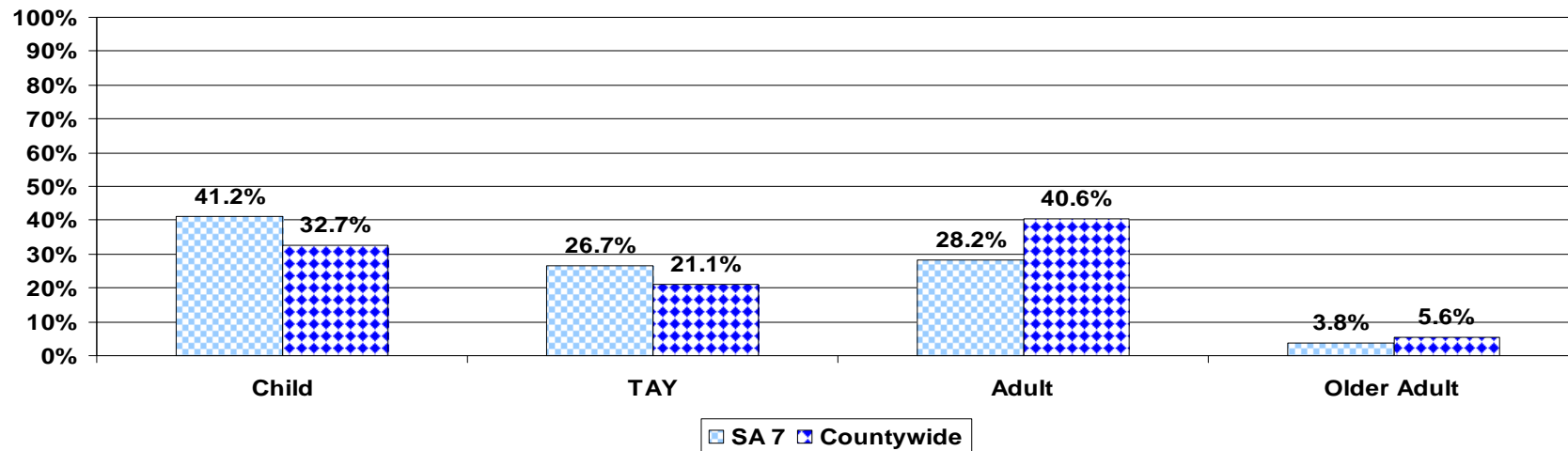
Figure 19: Consumers Served in Outpatient Short Doyle/Medi-Cal Facilities by Ethnicity in SA 7 Compared with Countywide FY 2010 - 2011

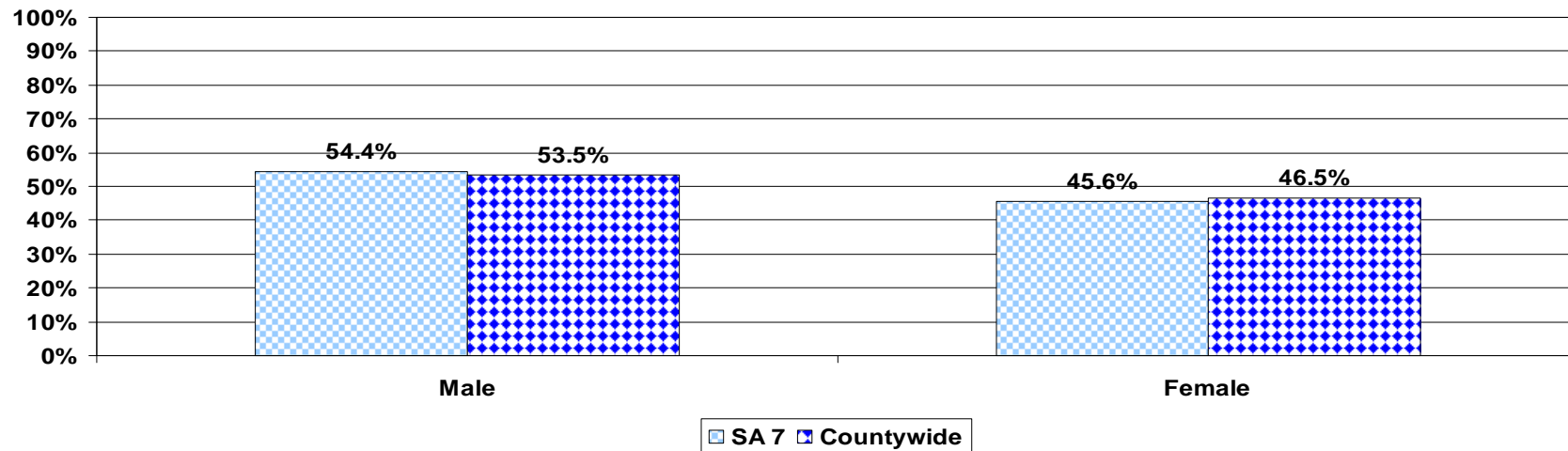
Figure 20: Consumers Served in Outpatient Short Doyle/Medi-Cal Facilities by Age Group in SA 7 Compared with Countywide FY 2010 - 2011

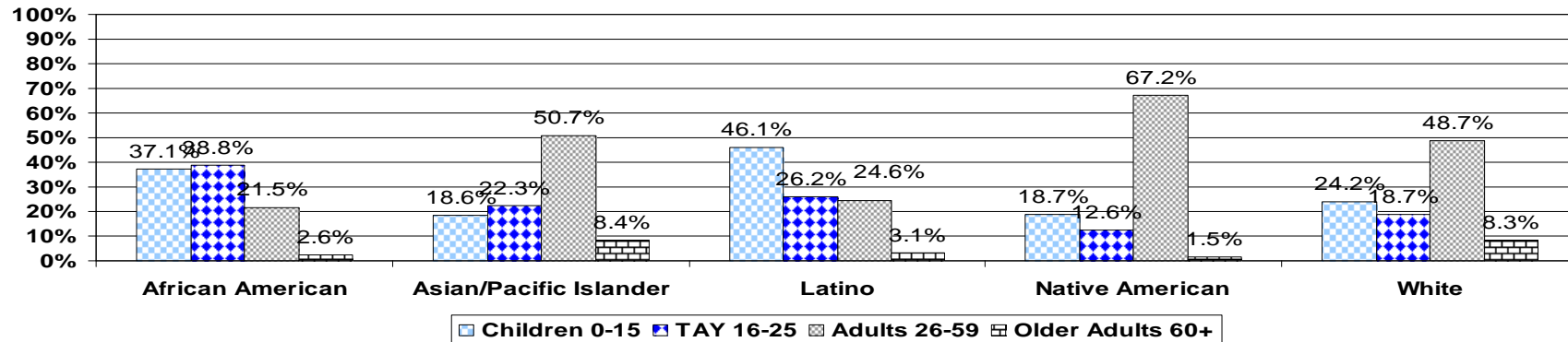

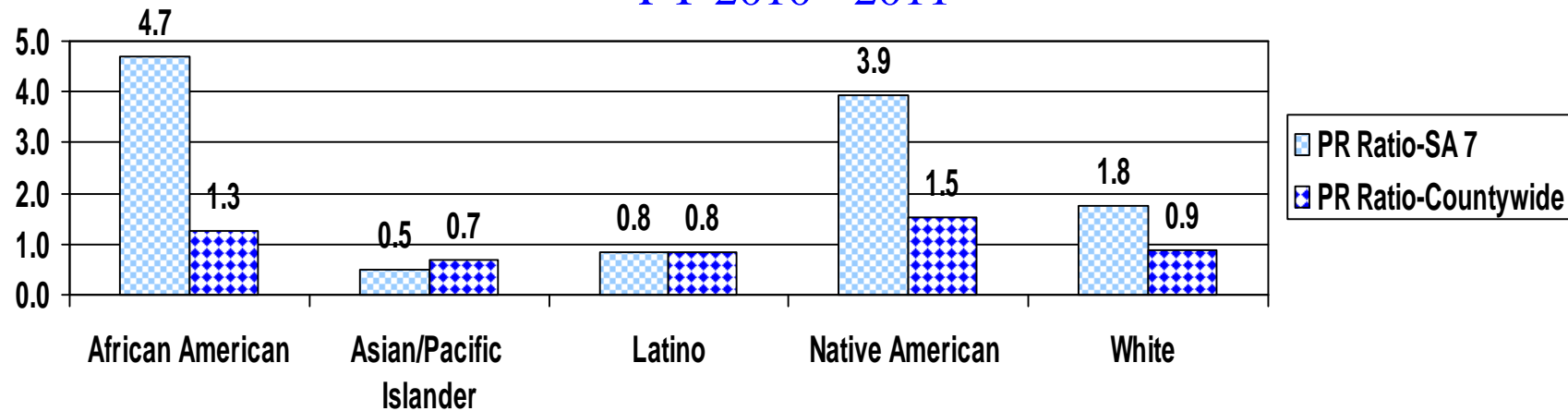
Figure 22: Consumers Served in SA 7 Outpatient Short Doyle/Medi-Cal Facilities by Ethnicity and Age Group

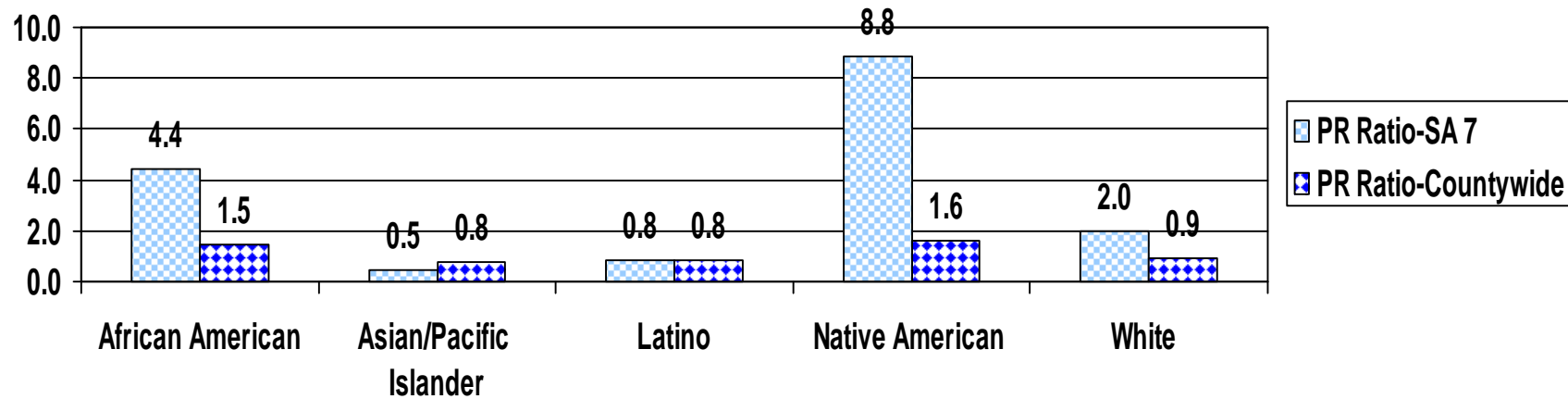
For example a PRR of 4.7 ( $293.6/62.7=4.7$ , see Table 1) for African Americans in SA 7 indicates that African Americans are 4.7 times as likely to receive MHS in SA 7 as compared with all other ethnic group consumers in SA 7. A PRR of 1.27 ( $293.6/232.0=1.27$ ) for African Americans –Countywide indicates that African Americans are 1.27 times as likely to receive MHS in SA 7 as compared with all other African American consumers in the County of Los Angeles. Please note that PRR only takes into account two factors and are not multivariate analysis.

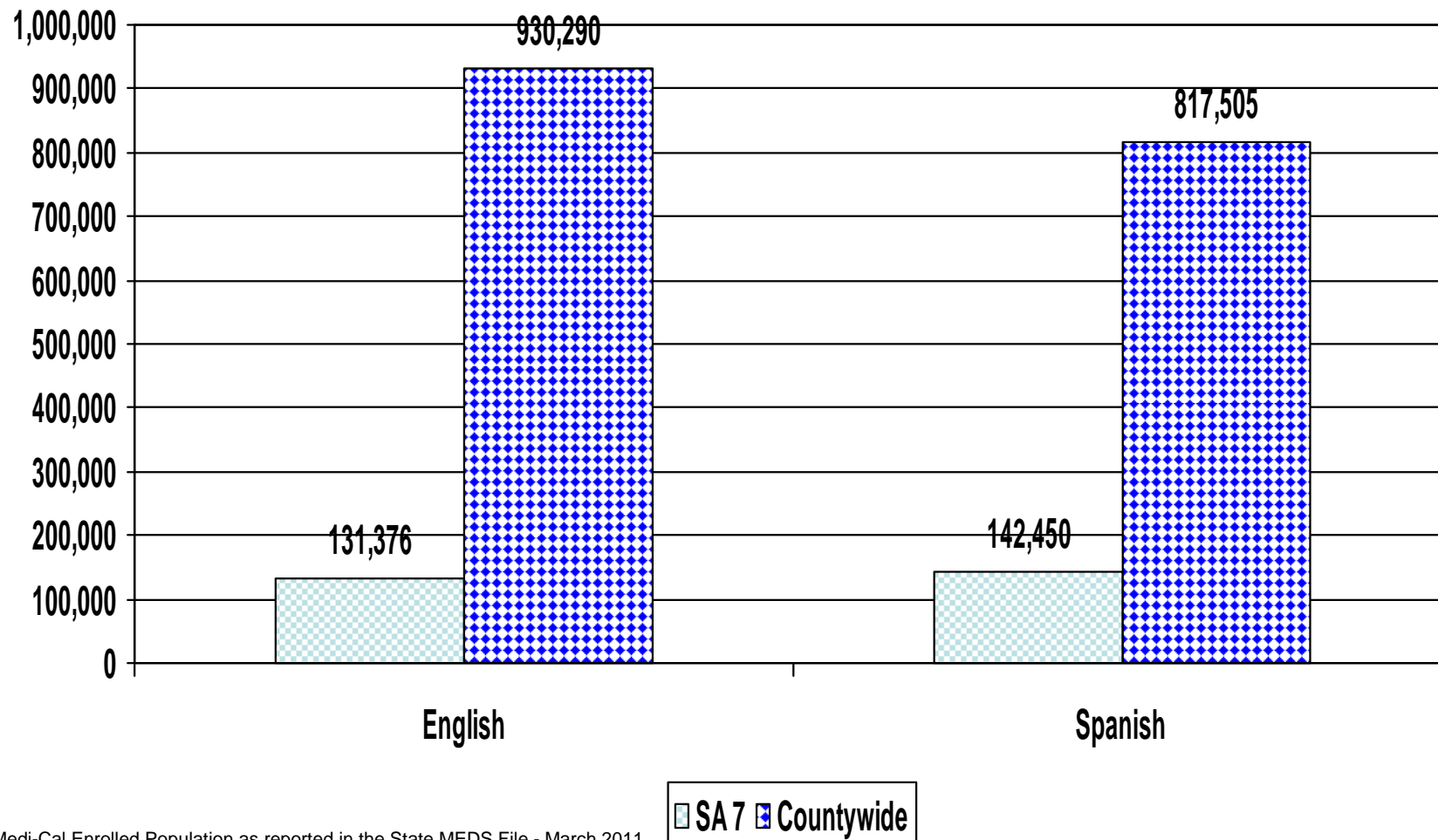

FY 2010 - 2011

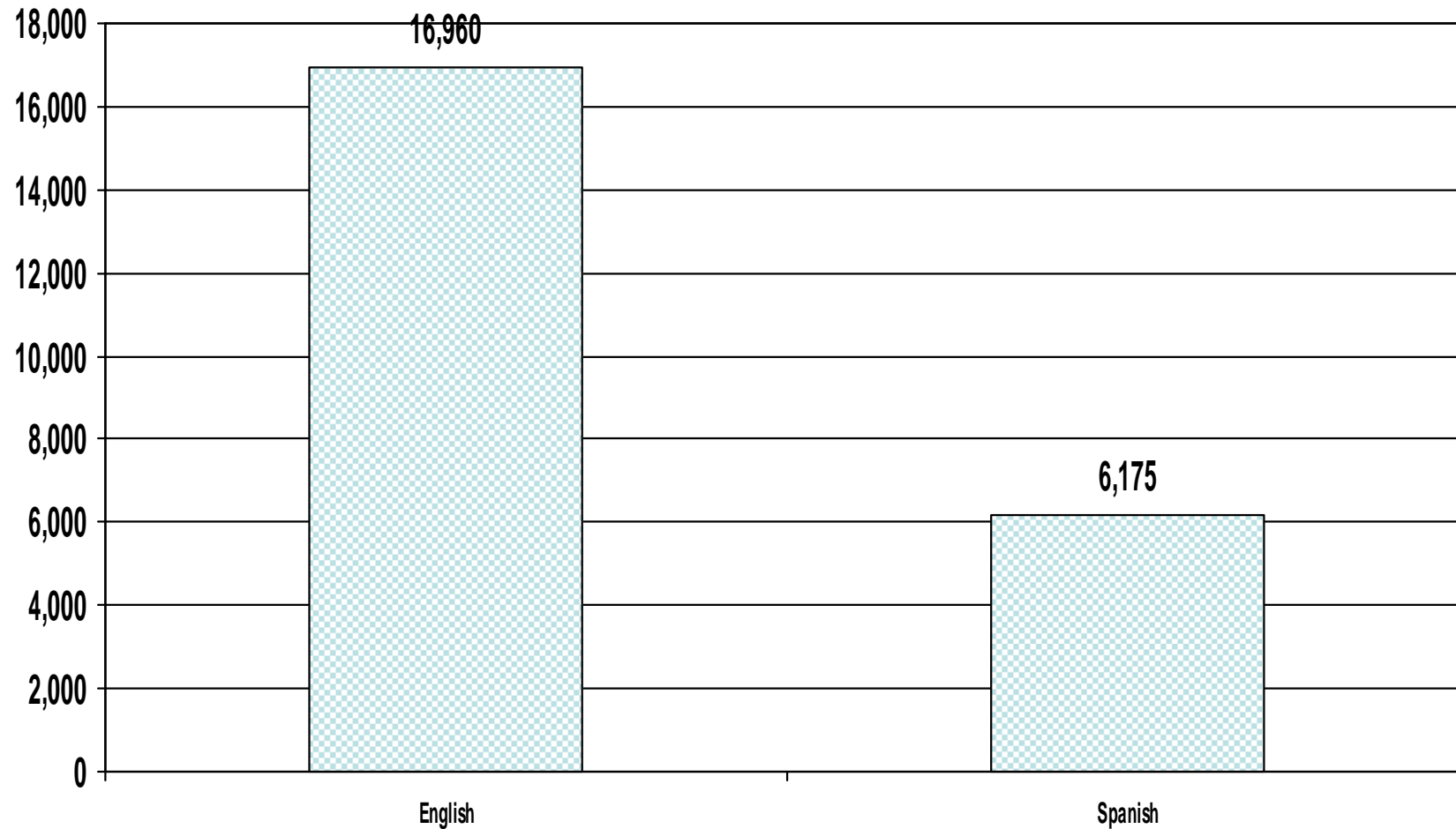
